




never participated in motorsport this will be a great opportunity to have a go under the watchful eyes of experienced TSOA members. More details will be provided in the next few months.

2022 Ecurie Triumph Report

2022 was a very lean year for Ecurie Triumph Racing with the ranks thinning due to sale of vehicles and loss of interest in historic racing. Competing in 2022 were Andrew Gibson TR3A, Graeme Rutledge TR6, Tony Dains TR6, Geoff Byrne TR6.

The year started off with a January meeting at Wakefield Park and we were lucky to get that in before the sh** hit the fan over the owners, (Benalla Sporting Car Club) development plans, which were objected to by a couple of local landowners. This resulted in the circuit being closed and at present there are no immediate plans for a reopening.

The three TR6s were plagued with reliability problems of every type over the year. Phillip Island in March was a disaster for the team with Tony blowing a motor with a rod through the block at the end of the straight, Graeme had a fuel pump failure and Geoff had a lithium battery quit on the dummy grid and in next race the metering unit failed. Andrew whose car was performing well, came down with Covid and had to withdraw. Having missed so much racing due to Covid I decided to take the TR6 to Morgan Park in May only to run into massive floods which isolated Warwick and caused the race meeting to be cancelled. Long drive for no racing.

Undeterred we went back to Morgan Park in July for a most enjoyable trouble-free meeting, sharing the track with fellow Queensland TR6 racer John Carson.

Winton in August is another favorite meeting but the gremlins struck again. After getting a great start from midfield I made up several places, grabbing second gear for the right hander the diff exploded but I was able to pull onto the grass, out of the way, thus avoiding the race being red flagged. Andrew in the TR3A ran a faultless race finishing well in all three races. Also racing in Group S were Gordon Bunyon (Vic) Spitfire and Paul Hogan (Vic) GT6.

The Victorians turned out a great field of 10 Triumphs at Sandown in November but no entries from NSW. Paul Hogan ran his GT6 in Groups S while the large field of modified Triumph took on the MGs in their series. The car to beat was Keith Ondarchies 5Lt Stag.

The final meeting of the year was at Sydney Motor Sport Park in early December with the TR6s of Graeme and Geoff entered for the annual 22 lap enduro. Graeme's bad luck continued with a blown head gasket in Qualifying which put him out for the weekend. I had a good run with no

problems, and with the help of James Rose and Allan Cameron to manage the compulsory pit stop, finished 14 in the 35 car enduro race and winning the trophy for the best presented car.



Multiple scams are an ever growing problem for all of us nowadays. The following article is a British experience nevertheless it does bring forward a few timely reminders and offer some advice that we might all benefit from.

• Scammers on British Classic Car Buy Swap Sell "Good evening everyone, I haven't been in contact for a while and it's unfortunate that I'm contacting you now because of the actions of a small number of users on British Classic Car Buy Swap Sell who have been either scammed by a few other users, or have certainly come close to.

It's been reported that a few of you have failed to receive items you have paid for, and then been met with unanswered calls when trying to follow up with the other party, while others have realised something isn't right when asked to pay more to cover the costs of insurance and the like......

I'd like to offer a few basic pieces of advice for those of you who have never come across anything like this before online.

Firstly, if you are going to pay someone for goods, only agree to pay if you have been in contact with them over the phone and consequently have their phone number. If all communication has been over email, especially at the insistence of the seller, and they refuse to speak over the phone, simply stop all communication with them. You are better off missing out on a potential bargain, then paying for it and not receiving it at all. Likewise, if they only ever call on a 'private number', again, don't bother with dealing with that particular seller.

Secondly, do not send cash in the post, or pay using a third party app on your phone or tablet that you are unfamiliar with. Only pay using your own financial institution's online banking system (i.e. funds transfer), or via a reputable online payment gateway like PayPal. Both options give you a greater chance to retrieve your money if necessary.

PayPal in particular takes scammers very seriously and has many measures in place to ensure you receive your funds back if any scam has occurred. Likewise, financial institutions are more willing to assist you now more than ever. If you are concerned before sending someone money, don't send them anything, get in touch with your financial institution first to find out what can be done if you do indeed need to have your money returned.

But above all, if you believe you have been in contact with a scammer on British Classic Car Buy Swap Sell, please let me know so I can notify you all "





History:

Bob Tullius' Group 44 team was the British Leyland (Jaguar Triumph) factory USA racing effort. They won the Trans Am title with the Jaguar XJS in 1977 and 1978. In 1979 British Leyland backed the Group 44 team in its development of the Triumph TR8. Bob Tullius realized the potential of the lightweight, aerodynamic V8 powered TR8 and proved that it was a race winner. In its debut race at the Watkins Glen 6 Hour, the TR8 dominated the class against the Corvettes and Camaros and finished 1st in class and 7th overall. It was so successful in SCCA competition that the SCCA continued to give the TR8 added weight penalties.

Consequently, Tullius took the TR8 to the IMSA series where it finished 1st in class and 6th overall at the Sebring 12 Hours. The TR8 continued to dominate the GTO class over the Chevrolet Corvettes and Porsche RSRs placing second in the IMSA GTO championship.



The British Leyland factory backed Group 44 team is one of the most recognizable in motorsports having gone on to race in the GTP category with the Jaguar powered GTP cars. The Triumph TR8 was one of the most successful SCCA and IMSA production-based racing cars built. With eight class wins in the 1979-1980 seasons and second place in the 1980 IMSA GTO points championship. Surviving in stunning original race condition as it left the racetrack at its final race – Sebring 12 Hours. Still with paint, body and mechanics from March 1981. This TR8

stayed with Bob Tullius and the Group 44 team until 2008 when selling to its second owner.

Sold in 2011 to its third owner who undertook a comprehensive restoration. Then selling to its fourth owner in 2019. This is an opportunity to acquire one of the most recognizable, successful and original SCCA/IMSA racing cars of the era. It is eligible to race today in most historic venues and would be a showstopper and race winner once again.
